Faculty Service Award 2016 Nominees



Dr. Christopher McCollough is an Assistant Professor of Communication. His research focuses on government media relations and public communication, as well as, research on the impact of service learning on civic engagement. Dr. McCollough is Columbus State University's representative to the American Democracy Project (ADP) and is the Vice Chair and 2016 Program Planner for the Public Relations Division of the Southern States Communication Association. Within the university, he currently serves on the Faculty Handbook Committee, Data Stewards Task Force, Education Advisory Board Task Force, and recently began serving on the Pasaquan Advisory Board, in addition to administrative support to his department. Within the community, Dr. McCollough serves as an active member of the American Cancer Society's Leadership Council for Muscogee County. He judges and coaches the Boys and Girls Club "Youth of the Year" competition, and is a pro bono public relations consultant for over 100 non-profit and local civic organizations.

Dr. Dell Miller is Assistant Director of the Undergraduate Program and Assistant Professor in the School of Nursing. She began her nursing career in 1975 after graduating with honors from Columbus College. Later she received a BSN from Columbus State University and a MSN from Troy State University in Adult Health/Administration. Her clinical practice experience focused on critical care, emergency/trauma and administration. She is also a paramedic and taught medics at Columbus Technical College from 1977 to 2002. Dr. Miller served as a clinical educator within the hospital and a community educator for the American Heart Association. She has served as the clinical educator for Region 7 EMS, which included 14 Georgia counties. Dr. Miller returned to school and received a post masters Family Nurse Practitioner certificate and a second M.S.N./Acute Care Nurse Practitioner from the University of Alabama - Birmingham, and earned a Doctorate in Nursing Practice from University of South Alabama. She has been employed at Columbus State University for seven years.

Dr. Yesem Peker is an Assistant Professor in the TSYS School of Computer Science. She received her B.S. degrees in Computer Engineering and Mathematics Departments from the Middle East Technical University in Ankara, Turkey where she completed her M.S. in Mathematics. Dr. Peker received a Ph.D. in Mathematics from Indiana University, Bloomington, IN. Her research focuses on applications of cryptography, in particular protocols that use cryptography to assure security as well design and analysis of cryptosystems. After completing a Ph.D., she went on to teach Mathematics first at Pomona College in Claremont, CA, then at Randolph College, in Lynchburg, VA. She joined the TSYS School of Computer Science in the spring of 2013.

Dr. Glenn Stokes is a Professor of Biology. He is finishing his 33rd year on the Biology faculty at Columbus State University. Dr. Stokes has taught courses at both the undergraduate and graduate level. He has crossed departmental lines in order to teach courses for both Chemistry and Psychology. His efforts in the classroom were rewarded when he received the Educator of the Year award for CSU in the spring of 2000. In addition to his teaching responsibilities, he has had the opportunity to serve in several administrative roles, including being the Acting Chairs of Computer Science, Nursing and Psychology & Sociology and the Director of the Environmental Science Master's Program. Also Dr. Stokes served as the Associate Dean of Science for over 20 years, and has served as Dean of the College of Science and later the College of Letters and Sciences. During his tenure, he has participated actively in the governance of the university through his service on several important committees such as the Statutes and Bylaws Committee, the LeNoir Hall Project Steering Committee, the First Choice Campaign Cabinet, and the Faculty Senate additionally. Dr. Stokes has served as the Faculty Athletics Representative to the NCAA for the last 22 years, and has been active on several national NCAA committees. Dr. Stokes continues pursuing his research interests, most recently with an ongoing study of the population dynamics of the Alligator Snapping Turtle population in Upatoi Creek.

Faculty Research and Scholarship Award 2016 Nominees



Dr. Clinton Barineau is Associate Professor of Geology and Chairperson of Earth & Space Sciences. He was born and raised near Tallahassee, Florida, where he earned a Ph.D. in Geology from Florida State University. Before joining Columbus State University (CSU) in 2007, Dr. Barineau taught for four years as a full-time instructor at Valdosta State University. Beginning in 1999, he taught as an Adjunct Instructor at Tallahassee Community College and Florida State University. Dr. Barineau was one of the founding members of CSU's Department of Earth and Space Sciences in 2009.

Dr. Rania Hodhod is an Assistant Professor in the TSYS School of Computer Science at Columbus State University (CSU). Dr. Hodhod teaches and supervises undergraduate and graduate students. Her research interests span a range of areas, such as Intelligent Systems, Machine Learning, Educational Games, and Computational Creativity. She has published over 40 reference articles and conference papers in these areas. Dr. Hodhod earned a Ph.D. degree from the University of York, UK in 2010. Before joining CSU in 2013, she was a post-doctoral research fellow in the Adaptive Digital Media Lab and the Entertainment Intelligence Lab at Georgia Tech University. In the past two years at CSU, she earned Columbus State University's Outstanding Teacher of Writing Award, Recognition of Excellence: Graduate Faculty Award, and Faculty Writing Fellowship Award. In addition to two winning interdisciplinary research projects and two winning state grants, last year, she led her undergraduate students to present their research work at the Big South Undergraduate Research Symposium in North Carolina where they won Best Presentation Award.

Mr. Rylan Steele is an established artist and Associate Professor of Photography at Columbus State University (CSU). He received an A.S. in Photographic Technology from the Southeastern Center for Photographic Studies at Daytona Beach Community College, a B.F.A. in Photography from Florida International University and a M.F.A in Photography from the University of Georgia. Professor Steele has exhibited photographs in numerous regional and national exhibition spaces over the last few years including the Georgia Museum of Contemporary Art, the Houston Center for Photography, the Light Factory in Charlotte, and the Ogden Museum of Southern Art. In 2015, he was named one of four finalists for the Hudgens Prize for Georgia Artists and was also a finalist for the Lange/Taylor Prize awarded by the Center for Documentary Studies.

CSU Teaching Excellence Award 2016 Nominees



Dr. Erinn Bentley is Assistant Chair of the Teacher Education Department and coordinates Secondary English education programs at Columbus State University. She has taught English in Japan and the United States. Currently, her research interests include writing, teacher education, and professional learning communities.

Dr. Phil Bryant is Assistant Professor of Marketing and Management in the D. Abbott Turner College of Business. He earned his Ph.D. in Management from the University of Memphis in 2009. Dr. Bryant joined Columbus State University's Turner College in 2010 to round out their Human Resource Management and Servant Leadership concentrations in their newly developed Masters of Science in Organizational Leadership program. Since joining the D. Abbott Turner College of Business, Dr. Bryant has written and published a book on Managing Employee Turnover, published a score of journal articles, earned two senior level certifications in Human Resource Management, and founded and edited the Turner College's flagship peer-reviewed journal, *Servant Leadership: Theory & Practice*.

Dr. Michelle DeBruyn is Associate Professor in Columbus State University's Schwob School of Music. She promotes healthy singing based upon the function of the voice and the most current physiological information available. Dr. DeBruyn teaches Studio Voice, Vocal Pedagogy, and team teaches Professional Materials for Vocal Performers, a course that she created. She completed both a Masters of Music (2002) and Doctorate of Musical Arts (2005) in Vocal Performance and Literature from the Eastman School of Music. Dr. DeBruyn has studied voice with Beverly Hay and Robert McIver, vocal pedagogy with William McIver, and has coached with Russell Miller, Benton Hess, and Sylvie Beaudette.

Dr. Shannon Godlove is Assistant Professor of English. She joined the Columbus State University (CSU) faculty in Fall 2012. Dr. Godlove serves as the English Department's Specialist in Medieval Literature. She holds a Bachelor's Degree in Medieval Studies from Smith College and a M.A. and Ph.D. in English Literature from University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Her research focuses on the literature and history of the Anglo-Saxons, and she has published several articles on Old and Middle English poetry, Latin letters written by Anglo-Saxon missionaries, and the Old Norse sagas of the Viking settlers of Iceland. Dr. Godlove regularly teaches courses including Medieval Literature in Britain, History of the English Language, Old English, World Literature before 1650, and English Composition, and has taught courses on topics including the poetry of Chaucer, Medieval Women Writers, and Tales of King Arthur. She also serves as the Faculty Coordinator for CSU's Interdisciplinary Medieval and Renaissance Studies Certificate program, which she started with a colleague in the Department of History and Geography in Fall 2013.

CSU Excellence in Online Teaching Award 2016 Nominees



Dr. Jennifer Pitts is an Associate Professor of Management Information Systems in the D. Abbott Turner College of Business at Columbus State University, where she teaches graduate and undergraduate courses in Information Systems and Project Management. Dr. Pitts holds the Rothschild Chair in Business Leadership, and serves as chair of the University's Distance Learning Committee. In 2014, she was Columbus State University's nominee for the Regent's Award for the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning. Her research has appeared in the *Journal of Applied Behavioral Science, Journal of Business Logistics, Journal of Information Systems Education*, and *Structural Equation Modeling: A Multidisciplinary Journal*.

Dr. Ramesh Rao is a Professor and the Associate Chair in the Department of Communication at Columbus State University (CSU). This year, he completes 30 years of teaching in the United States. He arrived at Hattiesburg, MS as a graduate student in September 1985, where he earned an M.S. in Mass Communication, before moving to East Lansing, MI, to earn a Ph.D. in Communication from Michigan State University, where he began teaching. He later taught at Truman State University in Kirksville, MO, and Longwood University in Farmville, VA. He came to CSU in May 2013 to chair the DegreeIn3 Program, and moved to the Department of Communication in July 2015. He has written, co-authored, and edited a number of books on Indian politics, culture, and society, and has co-authored a textbook on Intercultural Communication. Dr. Rao has taught a wide variety of communication courses: from Public Speaking to Mass Media Law; and from Persuasion to Intercultural Communication. Teaching online exclusively over the past three years, he fully understands the demands and challenges of offering online education.

CSU Scholarship of Teaching & Learning Award 2016 Nominees



Dr. Jennifer Brown is Assistant Professor of Educational Foundations in the Department of Teacher Education. Dr. Brown earned her Ph.D. in Educational Psychology with an emphasis in Educational Research from Auburn University in 2008. She earned her B.S.Ed., M.Ed., and Ed.S. degrees in Special Education from the University of West Georgia. Dr. Brown taught eight years as a high school Special Education teacher and three years as a high school Math teacher, and she earned National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) certification while in the classroom. Currently, she serves on the Executive Board for Eastern Educational Research Association. Dr. Brown's primary areas of expertise include Undergraduate Student Retention and Effective Instructional Strategies. Her research has been presented at regional and national conferences and published in national and international peer-reviewed journals.

Dr. Kathleen Hughes is an Associate Professor of Biology and is the Director of the Competitive Premedical Studies Program at Columbus State University (CSU). She has published work on Peer Leader Strategies and assessments in Human Anatomy and Physiology courses. Dr. Hughes has presented Peer Leader Development and Assessment in various Biology courses at the university level and has secured mini grants in this field. She will continue this presentation of work at the national Human Anatomy and Physiology Society meeting in May. Dr. Hughes coordinated a Service Learning Study Abroad course to the Bahamas. Her Neuroscience course includes student-authored research projects that are presented at state and regional scientific conferences. Dr. Hughes earned her B.S. in Biology from Winthrop University and her Ph.D. in Biomedical Science from the University of Florida.

Chappell Graduate Award 2016 Nominees



Dr. Kevin Burgess, a member of the Columbus State University faculty since 2008, is an Associate Professor in the Department of Biology. He received his Ph.D. from the University of Guelph in Canada, and has held Post-Doctoral Fellowships at the University of Virginia and the University of Toronto. Since arriving at Columbus State University, he has published eight peer-reviewed journal articles in high-impact, international journals. He has established a vigorous research program in pure and applied Ecological Genetics, mentoring seven graduate research theses and 15 undergraduate research projects. He has presented at more than 10 international and regional meetings and has given invited seminars at University of Georgia, Emory University, North Georgia College and State University, Georgia State University and Auburn University where he now holds an Adjunct position. He has written and received numerous internal and external grants to fund his research program and serves as a reviewer for 11 international journals. His involvement in cutting edge research on DNA barcoding has received local, national, and international media attention and has been featured on the Board of Regents website. Dr. Burgess strives to involve his graduate, honors, and undergraduate research students in all aspects of scholarship including: writing and receiving grants; data analysis and publishing; conference presentations; and teaching and mentoring.

Dr. Kirk C. Heriot is the Crowley Endowed Chair of Entrepreneurship. He received his M.B.A. from the University of South Carolina and his Ph.D. from Clemson University. He previously served as the Director of Graduate Business Programs at Columbus State University (CSU) during 2011-2012. In that time period, two new required courses were added to the curriculum. Since 2011, he has served as the Course Lead for Entrepreneurship in the Georgia Web MBA Program responsible for coordinating instructors from five other universities. He was the Interim Course Lead for Strategy in the Web M.B.A. Program in 2013-2014. In addition, Dr. Heriot teaches Entrepreneurship in the traditional MBA program at Columbus State University. He has taught four of the 10 required courses in the CSU MBA program in his nine years as a member of the faculty. In addition, he started the CSU Business Plan Competition, which is entering its fifth year. In the past eighteen months, two of his MBA students have started companies based on the business plans they began writing in his Entrepreneurship course. A third student started a business in Savannah after taking his Entrepreneurship course in the Web M.B.A. program. In addition to his teaching responsibilities, Dr. Heriot founded the *American Journal of Entrepreneurship* in 2008 and continues to serve as the editor. The journal published Volume 8(1) in June 2015.

Educator of the Year Award 2016 Nominees



Dr. Jeanine Fittipaldi-Wert is an Associate Professor of Health and Physical Education and Adapted Physical Education at Columbus State University (CSU). She earned her doctorate from Auburn University, her bachelor's degree in Health and Physical Education Teacher Certification from West Chester University, PA, and her Master's Degree in Adapted Physical Education from State University of New York (SUNY), Brockport, NY. In addition to her teaching responsibilities, she is also the Director of Camp Abilities in Columbus, GA, which is a developmental sports camp for children with visual impairments. She won the Mayor's Award: "Educator of the Year 2014" for Outstanding Service in Supporting People with Disabilities.

Dr. Tom Dolan is a Professor of Political Science at Columbus State University (CSU). He joined the CSU faculty in 2000 to develop an Asian Studies curriculum, and has twice served as the Chairman for the Department of Political Science. Dr. Dolan's academic career began after 20 years of military service, during which his travels included operations in the North Atlantic, Mediterranean Sea, South Pacific, and Indian Oceans. During this time he traveled extensively in South America, Asia, and East Africa. He received his Master's degree in National Security Affairs at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California, and his Ph.D. in Political Science from Georgia State University. In April 2011, he was selected as an Academic Fellow for the Foundation for Defense of Democracies, and during the summer of 2011. he underwent counterterrorism training in Israel in addition to teaching a course on Islam in Europe in Oxford, England. In 2012, he conducted research on his major area of study, Korean Reunification, in South Korea, China, and North Korea. In the summer of 2013, he returned to Oxford to teach. His professional work includes four dozen publications.

Ms. Pam Wetherington is the Program Coordinator and Instructor in the Early Childhood Education Program. Additionally, Ms. Wetherington serves as the Department of Teacher Education's edTPA Coordinator. Her professional interests include strengthening the preparation methods for pre-service teachers by ensuring that they are: (1) providing safe and respectful learning environments; (2) meeting their students' needs and interests as evidenced by their plans, instruction, and assessments; (3) prepared for the complexities of today's classrooms; and (4) confident in their abilities to serve as advocates for their students. Her research interests include thematic teaching/project-based learning and the effect on student performance and achievement; the effect of formative assessments and feedback on the development of pre-service teachers; and the effect of the development of teaching portfolios on pre-service teachers' self-efficacy.

Ms. Katherine Herczeg is an adjunct faculty member of the College of Nursing at Columbus State University. She has taught Pharmacology and Pathophysiology for the past three years. Ms. Herczeg is an honors graduate of the 2004 Columbus State University BSN program and the 2008 Georgia State University M.S.N. Family Nurse Practitioner Program. CSU International Educator of the Year Award 2016 Nominees



Dr. Becky Becker is Professor of Theatre and Assistant Director for Columbus State University's Center for International Education, where she coordinates the International Studies Certificate. She also heads the B.A. program in Theatre. In addition to teaching Theatre History, Dramaturgy, Playwriting and Devising Performance, she teaches Introduction to International Studies and Cross-Cultural Learning at Columbus State University. Her directing credits include: "A Midsummer Night's Dream", "The Laramie Project", "Eurydice, and Caroline", or "Change", as well as such new plays as "Compañeras", "The Old Ship of Zion", and "Mr. Burns: A Post-Electric Play". Dr. Becker has conceived and directed several oral history performances, including "Westville: Collected Lives," and "Bibb City: Collected Lives From a Mill Town". She serves as current editor for "Theatre Symposium: A Journal of the Southeastern Theatre Conference", Volumes 24 and 25, and is Vice Chair of the "National Playwriting Program" for Region 4 of the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival. Her research interests include cross-cultural theatre, intercultural communication, and the embodied mind. Her published works have appeared in Theatre Journal, Feminist Teacher, and Review: The Journal of Dramaturgy, Theatre Symposium, and various edited volumes.

Dr. Kevin Burgess is an Associate Professor in the Department of Biology and has been a member of the Columbus State University (CSU) faculty since 2008. He received his Ph. D. from the University of Guelph in Canada and has held Post-Doctoral Fellowships at the University of Virginia and the University of Toronto. Dr. Dona Lee Ferguson is an instructor in the Columbus State University (CSU) School of Nursing. Her nursing career spans more than 40 years, including starting as a Nurse's Aide and eventually receiving a Bachelor's and Master's degree in Nursing, both from the University of Southern Maine. In her academic career, she has taught in Associate Degree and Baccalaureate degree programs in Maine, South Dakota, Illinois, New Jersey, New York, and now in Columbus, Georgia.
