

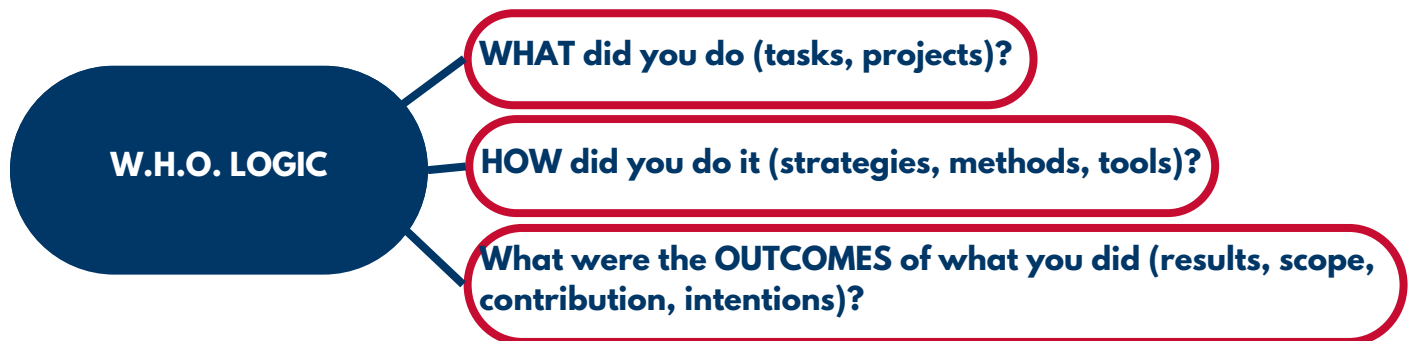
## Defining a Resume

- **Master Resume:** a compilation of all of your experiences (professional, academic projects, service, leadership) in one document; not limited to one page
- **Tailored Resume:** generally a one-page document that includes your most recent, most relevant, and most unique experiences; specific to a particular job description and the job responsibilities related to a position

*Pro Tip: Use JobScan to align the keywords you use in your tailored resume with those your potential employer uses in their job description. This will increase your chances of making it through Applicant Tracking Software (ATS) systems.*

## Designing Your Resume

- **Part 1: Contact Information** - Include your name, email address, phone number, and LinkedIn profile link.
- **Part 2: Skills, Trainings, and Certifications** - Include "hard skills" like specific computer, technical, business, and field-relevant skills, as well as language skills other than English. Include completed trainings and earned certifications/licenses.
- **Part 3: Education** - Include the name, city, and state of your college/university; the full name of your degree (no abbreviations like B.S., B.A., or B.B.A.); and your expected graduation date.
- **Part 4: Experiences** - For each position, include your title; the name, city, and state of your employer; and your dates employed. Use 3-7 bullet points beginning with a **strong action verb** and following **W.H.O. Logic**.



*Pro Tip: Incorporate "soft skills" or "people skills" like communication, collaboration, and leadership throughout your Experience bullet points.*

## Refining Your Resume

### Resume Do's and Dont's

- **DO** schedule a resume review with the Career Center for customized guidance
- **DO** tailor your resume for every position you apply for, rather than submitting your Master resume
- **DO** use consistent formatting to help make your resume look professional and easy to follow
- **DO** use the correct verb tenses (past or present) in each of your Experience bullet points
- **DO** proofread your resume and make necessary edits before submitting it
- **DO NOT** use first-person language (like I, my, me, we) or abbreviations
- **DO NOT** use full sentences in your Experience bullet points (instead, use phrases)
- **DO NOT** download external resume templates (instead, start fresh using the Career Center's Resume Example as a guide)
