The Columbus State University Competitive Premedical Studies Program (CPSP) was created in 2013 to better prepare students for medical school and, ultimately, address the physician shortage in Georgia and nationwide. The program goals include the following: recruit motivated, academically-talented students interested in a career in medicine; provide unique resources designed to increase the number of competitive medical school applicants; foster CSU connections to the local medical community; and establish CSU as the preferred premedical studies university in Georgia.
