FACULTY SERVICE AWARD

2013 NOMINEES

Dr. Barbara Hunt, Professor of English (Retired)

Dr. Hunt was a full-time Faculty member at CSU from 1975-2012, serving as Interim Associate Dean of University College from 1997-2000, Director of the CSU Honors Program from 1997-2006, and Chair of the Department of English from 2001-2012. Many of her service projects to the university have been in the form of communicating information to students or faculty via websites or podcasts, most notably the Advising Handbook website, a 13-minute advisor's training podcast, a website for College of Letters and Sciences Faculty to consult concerning procedures to report plagiarism, and a website centralizing information regarding student appeals .

Professor Michele McCrillis, Associate Professor of Art History

Professor McCrillis works with CSU's *Friends of Art* to promote and support the activities of the Department of Art and has been nominated this year by the College for the Arts for the Faculty Service Award in recognition of her outreach to community supporters. By educating the public through art talks, events, workshops and art trips, she has promoted the students, faculty, college and university while fostering a growing appreciation for the visual arts and art history in our region. This has led to considerable growth in private funding for scholarships, study abroad, visiting artists and scholars, exhibitions, and faculty development for the Department of Art. In 2011, Professor McCrillis and Professor Hannah Israel developed and launched a new "CSU in Italy" study abroad program, and led students to Florence and Venice for four weeks that summer.

Dr. Brian Schwartz, Professor of Biology

Dr. Schwartz is a professor and currently serves as Assistant Chair in the Department of Biology. Since joining the CSU faculty in 1996, Dr. Schwartz has been active on the Faculty Senate and on task forces related to shared governance, business intelligence, and implementation of a web-based advising and degree audit system. He serves on the General Education Committee, and in 2007, he served as Vice-Chair of the task force that formulated CSU's Quality Enhancement Plan (*Writing the Solution*). He also served on the advisory committee that oversaw its early implementation. Dr. Schwartz currently serves as co-adviser of the Tri-Beta Biology Club and as secretary of CSU's Chapter of Phi Kappa Phi. In the community, he has served for many years as a judge in the Regional Science Fair and as an event supervisor for the Science Olympiad. He recently joined the governing board of the Muscogee County Genealogical Society, and was a long-time member of the governing board of the Genetics Society of Georgia, serving one term as its president.

Dr. Gary Shoupe, Associate Professor of Counseling, Foundations and Leadership

Dr. Shoupe was nominated for the Faculty Service Award both for his leadership in integrating technology into the classroom and for freely sharing this knowledge with fellow Faculty members. He was instrumental in developing the first fully online Master's degree in Educational Leadership for CSU, and has recently led his department into developing and implementing the Specialist in Educational Leadership Program transition from face to face to a fully online environment. Through his peer coaching, he has had a positive influence on the shape and quality of a vast number of his peers' online courses here at CSU. As Chair of the Distance Learning Committee, he has led the effort to develop and create the first policy recommendations for CSU's Distance Learning courses and online instruction.

Dr. Wayne Summers, Professor of Computer Science

Dr. Summers currently serves as the Department Chair in the TSYS School of Computer Science. He has been actively involved in providing service to the computer science and technology communities on regional, national, and international levels. He served eleven years as a Course Director for the National Science Foundation's Chautauqua Program at University of Dayton, conducting workshops for nearly 500 Faculty from across the United States, including a workshop on Computer Security sponsored by the National Security Agency. He has served as the external examiner for several universities in Malaysia and the United States. Dr. Summers served for four years in the Peace Corps as a Math-Science Secondary School Teacher in a rural community in Malaysia on the island of Borneo. His involvement with the local K-12 schools through Broadening Participation in Computing initiatives, Summer Camps, and First Lego League competitions continues his active involvement working with K-12 students, teachers, and schools. Dr. Summers and his students have received recognition for bringing the Internet to every classroom in over ten schools in rural New Mexico.

FACULTY RESEARCH AND SCHOLARSHIP AWARD 2013 NOMINEES

Dr. Jennifer L. Brown, Assistant Professor of Education Foundation

Within the last two years, Dr. Brown has published her research in six articles within a variety of regional and national publications and presented at four regional and national conferences. She has acquired two externally funded grants to support professional development of high school mathematics teachers through the Columbus Regional Mathematics Collaborative. Her third grant application to examine the relationship between the *Seven Principles for Good Practice in Undergraduate Education*, academic integration, subsequent institutional commitment, student performance, and student retention among 15 commuter institutions within the University System of Georgia is pending with Institute of Education Sciences. As a hallmark of her research agenda, Dr. Brown has developed a freshman orientation survey that is administered to all incoming freshmen within the College of Education and Health Professions during summer orientation. This survey data is merged with institutional research data to examine retention trends and variable relationships among undergraduate students in the College.

Dr. Kevin S. Burgess, Associate Professor of Biology

Since arriving at CSU, Dr. Burgess has published eight peer-reviewed journal articles in high-impact, international journals. He has established a vigorous research program in pure and applied Ecological Genetics, mentoring seven graduate research theses and 15 undergraduate research projects. He has presented at more than 10 international and regional meetings and has given invited seminars at UGA, Emory, NGCSU, GSU and Auburn University. He has written and received numerous internal and external grants to fund his research program and serves as a reviewer for 11 international journals. His involvement in cutting edge research on DNA barcoding has received local, national and international media attention as well as being featured on the Board of Regents website. Dr. Burgess strives to involve his graduate, honors and undergraduate research students in all aspects of scholarship including writing and receiving grants, data analysis and publishing, conference presentations, teaching and mentoring.

Dr. Johnny Ho, Professor of Operations Management

During the past five years, Dr. Ho has published 18 articles in top journals, such as *Mathematical and Computer Modeling* (Elsevier), *Computers & Operations Research* (Elsevier), *OMEGA – The International Journal of Management Science* (Elsevier), *Computers & Industrial Engineering* (Elsevier), and *International Journal of Production Research* (Taylor & Francis). In 2011, he received the *Annual Best Paper Award* from the Chinese Institute of Industrial Engineers. This award is given annually to the best paper among all those appearing in the *Journal of the Chinese Institute of Industrial Engineers* in a given year. He also accepted the *Best Paper in Conference Award* at the Southeast INFORMS Annual Conference held on October 1-3, 2008. His research has been cited 385 times since 2008 (799 times overall) according to Google Scholar.

Dr. Barbara J. Johnston, Assistant Professor of Art History

Dr. Johnston specializes in European art and architecture of the Renaissance and Baroque eras. Her current research focuses on the religious and political complexities inherent in the *Vie de la Magdalene*, a French Renaissance manuscript depicting the life of Mary Magdalene that was created for Louise of Savoy, mother of French king Francis I. Dr. Johnston has presented papers on this topic at professional conferences including the annual meetings of the Renaissance Society of America in Venice in 2010 and in San Diego in 2013. Her article, "The Magdalene and 'Madame': Piety, Politics, and Personal Agenda in Louise of Savoy's *Vie de la Magdalene*," is featured as a chapter in *Mary Magdalene: Iconographic Studies from the Middle Ages through the Baroque*, an anthology published in 2012. She is currently preparing a manuscript on the *Vie de la Magdalene* for publication with an academic press.

Dr. Paulina Kuforiji, Professor of Education & Dr. Bonita Williams, Professor of Reading Education (joint nominees)

Dr. Kuforiji and Dr. Williams have embarked upon a research agenda that focuses on the scholarship of teaching and learning in both traditional and online environments. For the 2012-2013 academic year, Dr. Kuforiji and Dr. Williams have presented two scholarly papers at international conferences, one at a national conference and one at a state/regional conference. They have four recent (2011-2012) publications in two national peer-reviewed journals. Avid supporters of graduate student research, Dr. Kuforiji and Dr. Williams organize the Department of Teacher Education Graduate Symposium at the master degree level each fall and spring semester and individually serve on a total of six dissertation committees for Doctor of Education candidates.

Dr. Frank Mixon, Visiting Professor of Economics

Prior to joining the Faculty at Columbus State University in 2010, Dr. Mixon served on the Faculty at the University of Southern Mississippi for 14 years. He has co-authored or co-edited five scholarly books, and published numerous journal articles. His latest book, *New Developments in Economic Education*, is slated for publication by Edward Elgar Publishing later this year. His research has appeared in *Economic Inquiry*, *Journal of Applied Econometrics*, *Journal of Economic Perspectives*, *Journal of Money, Credit, and Banking*, *Labour Economics*, *Oxford Bulletin of Economics and Statistics* and *Public Choice*, to name a few. His research has been cited by other researchers in studies appearing in more than 330 different academic journals. In 2004, he was named in the journal *Public Choice* as one of the Top 20 public choice economics scholars worldwide.

Dr. Nick Norwood, Professor of English

Dr. Norwood's third full volume of poetry, *Gravel and Hawk*, won the Hollis Summers Prize in Poetry, a nationwide contest, and was published by Ohio University Press in 2012. His other books are *A Palace for the Heart* (2004), *The Soft Blare* (2003), and the limited edition, fine press book *Wrestle* (2007). Dr. Norwood has been awarded an International Merit Award in Poetry from *Atlanta Review*. In October, 2012, his poem "A.M." was selected Poem of the Week by the PBS News Hour and published on its online blog Art Beat. At the Euroscience Open Forum, he has twice served as the sole poet to represent the United States (Munich 2006, Turin 2010). Norwood has also published critical articles, reviews, and interviews in peer-reviewed journals and scholarly books. He has recently given readings and master classes at The New School in New York, Ramapo College in New Jersey, and Texas A&M-Textarkana.

USG REGENTS TEACHING EXCELLENCE AWARD 2013 NOMINEE

Professor Sergiu Schwartz, Professor of Violin

Professor Schwartz's international concert appearances have taken him to major music centers on four continents, including twenty European countries, Israel, Asia, Canada, and over forty states in the U.S. His honors include prizes in international violin competitions in the United States and Europe, as well as awards from the National Endowment for the Arts and the National Foundation for the Advancement of the Arts. Professor Schwartz holds The William B. and Sue Marie Turner Distinguished Chair in Music at the Schwob School of Music. He frequently conducts master classes and lectures at music schools in the U.S., Canada, Europe, Asia, and Israel, and serves as a juror in major international competitions, including Tchaikovsky, Sarasate, Wieniawski, Oistrakh, Szeryng, Sphinx, Stulberg, Blount, Canadian National, and others. His students have been top prizewinners in prestigious international violin competitions in Italy, Russia, Spain, Mexico, Canada and the United States..

USG REGENTS SCHOLARSHIP OF TEACHING AND LEARNING AWARD 2013 NOMINEE

Dr. Edward O'Donnell, Assistant Professor of Marketing

Dr. O'Donnell has over twelve years of program management experience in the aircraft and hydraulic industries, and has taught doctoral courses in Survey Research Methods and Advanced Regression Analysis. His current research interests involve international product strategy, sales management, and inter-organizational business relationships. He is a past recipient of Kent State University's Golden "M" Teaching Award, Syracuse University's Experiential Classroom Outstanding Case Teaching Award, UTEP's Best Paper Award, and Columbus State University's Faculty Research and Scholarship Award. He has research published in *The Journal of Management Studies*, *The International Management Review*, *The Marketing Management Journal*, and *The Frontiers of Entrepreneurship Research*.

WILLIAM "BILL" CHAPPELL GRADUATE FACULTY AWARD 2013 NOMINEES

Dr. Jan G. Burcham, Professor of Early Childhood Education

Dr. Burcham holds the Fletcher Distinguished Chair of Teacher Education, and serves as Program Coordinator for the new M.Ed. in Teacher Leadership. Dr. Burcham mentors graduate students through teaching and advisement as well as supervising students' Specialist Research Projects and dissertations. She engages students in research through course assignments, through graduate assistantships, and through presentations at national conferences. She serves as the Editor of the COEHP journal, *Perspectives in Learning*, where students are encouraged to publish their work. Dr. Burcham uses research-based techniques to model the methods she is teaching. She also directs the award winning program, Summer Spectacular, where graduate students have the opportunity to engage in research, observe model teaching, and learn new techniques. Her scholarship, which includes multiple peer-reviewed journal publications and two books, centers around improving teaching and learning using constructivist theoretical principles. Dr. Burcham also serves on numerous committees that relate to graduate programs, and serves in the community through work with area schools and volunteering.

Dr. Kimberly Gill, Assistant Professor of Political Science

Dr. Gill serves as the Director of the Public Administration Program, the Director of the PA Government Administration track, and the Director of the PA Justice Systems Administration track at CSU. In her capacity as MPA Director and as an Assistant Professor, she has served as the advisor to the Pre-Law Organization and Public Heroes group, as well as on numerous committees for the department, the college and the university. Currently, she is Chair Elect of the Graduate Council, Graduate Council representative on the Strategic Planning Commission, and a member of the Intellectual Properties Committee. She serves the community as a Mediator for the Third Judicial District of Georgia, Volunteer Arbitrator for the Better Business Bureau, Court Appointed Special Advocate, ALM Special Liaison to Fort Benning, and Volunteer Arbitrator for the UGA Georgia Land Use Annexation Council. She has participated in the Quality Matters Program, revised the comprehensive exam, created the Capstone Course, and implemented the use of student portfolios to better assess student mastery of the core concepts and to provide the students with an example of their professional and academic abilities. She was awarded an Outstanding Teacher of Writing Award in 2012.

Dr. Kirk Heriot, Associate Professor of Management

Dr. Heriot joined the faculty at CSU in 2006 as the Crowley Endowed Chair of Entrepreneurship and teaches in both the traditional MBA program and the Georgia Web MBA program. In 2011-2012, he served as the Director of Graduate Business Programs for the College of Business. During this time, the college modified their learning goals and changed the curriculum in the MBA program to reflect changes in the external business environment. He has served as the Course Lead for Entrepreneurship within the Georgia Web MBA program since August 2011, coordinating the efforts of Faculty at six member institutions. Dr. Heriot engages students in both the practical and the intellectual considerations in his courses based upon his 35 peer-reviewed journal articles and his career in industry and the military. In addition to his work in the graduate business programs, Dr. Heriot's undergraduate students were recognized for their efforts working with over 600 elementary age children as part of Junior Achievement. In addition, students in his Small Business Management class have provided over 150 free consulting projects for small businesses in Muscogee County and the surrounding region since 2006.

EDUCATOR OF THE YEAR AWARD

2013 FINALISTS

Dr. Rose Danek

Dr. Rose Danek joined the Faculty of Columbus State University in 2012, and is currently an Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychology. Dr. Danek received her Bachelor's degree from Arizona State University, Master's degree from Pennsylvania State University, and her Doctorate of Philosophy in Psychology from the University of Iowa. Dr. Danek began her teaching career as an instructor at University of Iowa in 2008, followed by two years as a Visiting Assistant Professor of Psychology at Illinois Wesleyan University. Her research has focused on cognitive psychology, including the use of environmental information in decision-making, visual attention and the role of correlational and incidental learning in information processing. She has co-authored six articles in major psychology journals.

Dr. Kyle Christensen

Dr. Kyle Christensen joined the Faculty of Columbus State University in 2009, and is currently an Assistant Professor of Political Science and Public Administration in the Department of Political Science. He is also the Director of the Social Research Center, which assists both faculty and students with their various research projects. Dr. Christensen received his Bachelor's degree from Mercer University in 2004, and his Master's degree (2007) and his Doctorate in Political Science (2010) from West Virginia University. His research interests include foreign policy analysis and comparative political behavior, and he has published his research in quality peer-reviewed journals. Dr. Christensen was instrumental in the launch of *Momentum*, Columbus State University's research journal. He has served as the Faculty Advisor to Columbus State University's chapter of Pi Sigma Alpha and the International Relations Club.

Dr. Clinton Barineau

Dr. Clinton Barineau joined the Faculty of Columbus State University in 2007, and is currently an Assistant Professor of Chemistry and Geology in the Department of Earth and Space Sciences. Prior to coming to Columbus State University, Dr. Barineau taught at Valdosta State University (2001-2005). He earned his Ph.D. in Geology from Florida State University in 2009. His research has focused on the geologic evolution of the southern Appalachian Mountains and eastern North America, and his research results have been presented at national and regional meetings of the Geological Society of America. Dr. Barineau played a key role in the creation of the Earth and Space Sciences degree program, and has taught a wide variety of courses including Natural Disasters, Mineralogy, Igneous and Metamorphic Geology, Structural Geology and Geophysics-Tectonics.
