Dr. Seon Jeon, Language and Linguistics

Dr. Seon Jeon approaches teaching as a space for dialogue, reflection, and connection. She uses language as a way for students to explore identity, culture, and communication, encouraging them to think more deeply about how language shapes human experience. Her classroom emphasizes interaction and trust, where students are invited to share perspectives and engage with ideas through discussion. Drawing from her experiences across languages and cultures, she incorporates global perspectives that challenge students to think beyond their immediate context. She values creating an environment where students feel comfortable expressing themselves while also being pushed to develop stronger critical thinking and communication skills.

Dr. Nehal Shukla, Mathematics

Dr. Nehal Shukla's teaching focuses on changing how students experience mathematics by making learning more active, accessible, and engaging. She incorporates approaches such as collaborative work, applied problem solving, and flipped instruction to move students beyond memorization and into deeper understanding. Recognizing that many students come into mathematics with hesitation, she works intentionally to build confidence and resilience, encouraging students to view challenges as part of the learning process. She also integrates tools such as MATLAB, LaTeX, and Excel to strengthen both conceptual understanding and practical skills. Her commitment to accessibility is reflected in her work with open educational resources, helping reduce barriers while supporting long-term student success.

Professor Joshua May, Performing Arts

Professor Joshua May is a performing arts educator at Columbus State University whose teaching is built around the idea that students learn best through active creation. He leads students through the full production process, from early concept and analysis to performance, helping them understand both the artistic and technical demands of the field. His courses emphasize collaboration, critical thinking, and adaptability, preparing students to navigate the realities of professional creative environments. Drawing from his work in directing and mentorship, he integrates real world experiences such as internships, portfolio development, and production work into his teaching. He also places strong value on reflection and growth, encouraging students to learn from both successful and unsuccessful outcomes. By creating a space that mirrors professional practice while remaining supportive, Professor May helps students build confidence, take ownership of their work, and develop a clear artistic voice.

Dr. Eugen Ionascu, Mathematics

Dr. Eugen Ionascu brings a thoughtful and structured approach to teaching mathematics, grounded in both content mastery and an understanding of how students learn. He emphasizes clarity and depth, often using detailed explanations, real world examples, and connections to history and philosophy to make complex ideas more approachable. His teaching encourages students to actively engage with material through discussion and problem solving rather than passive learning. He also believes in the importance of developing discipline and consistency in studying mathematics, helping students build habits that lead to long term understanding. Through this approach, he not only strengthens students' technical skills but also helps them develop a greater appreciation for the subject.

Professor Molly Classen, Performing Arts

Professor Molly Classen's teaching is centered on collaboration, experimentation, and the process of discovery within the arts. She works closely with students in directing and production-based courses, where learning happens through doing, reflecting, and refining. Her classroom is designed to be both supportive and challenging, encouraging students to take creative risks while developing critical thinking and problem-solving skills. She integrates research, analysis, and performance, often connecting student work to real world contexts and professional expectations. Through mentorship and hands on experience, she helps students build confidence in their creative voice while also preparing them to work effectively in collaborative artistic environments.

Zoe Rasso

Zoe Rasso is a senior BFA Painting major who will graduate with Honors in May 2026, maintaining a perfect 4.0 GPA. A four-year member of the Honors College, her studies have been enriched through international experiences in Japan and Italy. Zoe brings a rare balance of artistic excellence, leadership, and professionalism through extensive internships in printmaking, studio practice, and archival work, as well as her roles as Student Assistant to the Dean of the College of the Arts and Art Department Student Assistant. Her work has been exhibited nationally and internationally, including the International Printmaking Exhibition and the Columbus State Juried Art Exhibition. A committed community partner and student leader, Zoe is a multi-year recipient of Friends of Art scholarships and numerous juried awards, reflecting a career defined by consistency, collaboration, and creative distinction.

FIZA KHAN

Fiza is an accomplished scholar and servant leader whose undergraduate career reflects outstanding academic excellence, leadership, and service. She graduated with a 4.0 GPA as a Presidential Scholar, earning continuous placement on the President's List and recognition through Phi Kappa Phi. She was selected as Columbus State University's recipient of the University System of Georgia Academic Recognition Day Award, honoring the top undergraduate student in the institution. Fiza held numerous leadership roles, including Vice President of Honoris Causa in the Honors College, member of the Presidential Envoy Program, and student representative on the Provost Search Committee. Through the Servant Leadership Program, she completed over 500 hours of community service and led initiatives such as *Read Across Columbus*, a citywide literacy outreach program. Her professional and academic mentorship includes service as a PLTL Biology leader and Lead Medical Scribe, where she trains new team members. In recognition of her academic achievement and commitment to medicine, Fiza has been accepted to Mercer University School of Medicine, where she will matriculate in Fall 2026.

Elizabeth Woods

Elizabeth Woods is a distinguished student leader and scholar who has served as Editor-in-Chief of *The Arden*, Columbus State University's student literary journal, in 2024 and 2026, and as co-editor in 2025. Under her leadership, *The Arden* earned two second-place awards at the Southern Literary Festival, with several selected works also receiving top honors, including First Place in Short Story and Expository Essay. A double major, Elizabeth has earned the highest academic awards in both disciplines, receiving the Outstanding Student in the French Track Award (2025) and the English Student of Excellence Award (2026). Deeply committed to service, she volunteers weekly at Trinity Episcopal Church and participates in community outreach through Honoris Causa. Through her leadership, scholarship, and service, Elizabeth exemplifies academic excellence and dedication to uplifting others.

Chloe Curbelo

Chloe is an accomplished scholar and emerging leader whose work reflects strong academic achievement, historical inquiry, and service. She is a member of Phi Alpha Theta, the National History Honor Society, and the Honors College, graduating *magna cum laude* and earning the prestigious Boren Scholarship. During her time at CSU, Chloe demonstrated leadership as co-manager and editor of the podcast series *Who Cares About Marquis de Lafayette* and as a recipient of a Servant Leadership Grant. She also contributed to a student-led historical research project examining the life and legacy of Dr. Ronald B. Daniel, helping to produce a published biography and digital exhibit highlighting his advocacy for educational equity in Columbus. In recognition of her academic excellence and dedication, Chloe has been accepted into the Asian Studies M.A. program at the University of California, Berkeley.
