Program Modifications:

- Based on data collected from supervisors, employers, and alumni, program faculty made the following modifications:
 - o Increased emphasis on consultation practices, the role of supervision throughout counseling training, and boundary setting in ethics courses; reinforced in practicum and internship experiences.
 - o Split school counseling internship experiences into two separate 300-hour experiences, similar to clinical mental health counseling internship experiences; although this was feedback from school counseling supervisors, program faculty had already planned for this change to take effect Fall 2024.
 - o Increased emphasis on training for models of supervision for both clinical and school counseling supervisors during Spring 2024 site supervisor training workshop.

- o Increased integration of cultural and social justice concepts and practices throughout the counseling curriculum (i.e., additional attention in each course from what had already taken place).
- Additional professional development activities and opportunities through student organization activity (e.g., funding for scholarship to support student professional development, workshops hosted by professionals within the community, etc.).
- Additional resources provided to students in advance of *preparing* for CPCE; study sessions also hosted by counseling student organizations.
- Based on assessment data and missed benchmarks from the previous academic year, program faculty made the following modifications:
 - o Increased attention to content addressed with counselor trainees in the *Cultural Perspectives in Counseling* course; this along with other efforts resulted in 100% of students meeting benchmark for the KPI 2 CPCE benchmark (up from 69%).
 - Examining and modifying aspects of the key assessment assignment and evaluation process in the *Human Growth and Development* course for the KPI 3 knowledge-based assessment point benchmark; this only resulted in a moderate change (63% met benchmark compared to previous year's 58%); as such, additional attention will be given to assessment processes and assignment revision for AY2024-25.
 - Examining and modifying aspects of the key assessment assignment and evaluation process in the *Individual Analysis* course for the KPI 7 knowledge-based assessment point benchmark; changes did not result in the desired outcome; as such, additional attention will be given to assessment processes and assignment revision for AY2024-25.
- Program faculty filled need for fourth full-time faculty member, of which has a school counseling background.

Program Goals:

- Program enhancements
 - o Program faculty aim to build on existing compliant practices in order to renew/maintain CACREP accreditation while also working to transition programmatic processes to be compliant with newer 2024 CACREP standards.
 - o Program faculty aims to increase community collaborations, providing more opportunities for counselor trainee involvement in both pre- and during practicum and internship experiences.

- o Program faculty aims to move comprehensive assessment processes to Tk20, similarly to practicum and internship assessment practices. Program faculty will collaborate with appropriate administration and staff to accomplish this task.
- o Program faculty have identified the need for a more consistent and higher quality web presence. Faculty will collaborate with appropriate administration and staff to strengthen web presence, allowing for more effective recruitment and alumni/supervisor/current student engagement.
- o Program faculty have reviewed comprehensive data and will discuss changes to address benchmarks not met but also with the intention of further improving assessment processes and counselor training.
