

Dual Enrollment

Eligible high school students who are enrolled at an eligible Georgia high school, home school, or home study program may participate in the Dual Enrollment program. Students can enroll in up to 15 credit hours per semester to earn both high school and college credits.

Student Eligibility

To be eligible for the Dual Enrollment program a student must:

- Be a rising junior or senior at an eligible Georgia high school, home school or home study program.
- Be on track to graduate
- Obtain approval of the high school guidance counselor and parent(s)/legal guardian(s).
- Be enrolled in courses listed in the approved [Dual Enrollment Course Directory](#)

Financial Aid (Dual Enrollment) Priority Deadline

- Fall semester: May 30th
- Spring semester: November 1st
- Summer semester: April 15th

*Note: All deadline dates are subject to change.

Cost

English, math, social sciences, sciences, and languages up to 15 credit hours per semester, are covered under the Dual Enrollment program. Any additional credit hours and/or courses not covered under Dual Enrollment must be paid for out of pocket. Should you change your CSU class schedule after the Add/Drop dates, you are held responsible for full payment (refer to the [CSU Academic Calendar](#) for Fee Payment Deadlines). All required textbooks for Dual Enrollment approved courses will be provided to the student at no cost; please refer to the CSU Bookstore Agreement form provided by your CSU Academic Advisor for further information.

Dual Enrollment Funding

How to apply:

Step 1: Student must create a student account at <https://www.gafutures.org/>

Step 2: Student and parent must complete the student and parent section of the Dual Enrollment application.

Step 3: Student must take their CSU course schedule to their high school guidance counselor.

Step 4: High school guidance counselor enters each registered course into the student Dual Enrollment online application.

Step 5: Financial Aid officer will confirm that the courses are correct in both database systems

Step 6: Financial Aid Officer will award Dual Enrollment funds

Step 7: Any additional cost or lab fees not covered by Dual Enrollment is the responsibility of the student and parent. You must renew your Dual Enrollment application every semester.
