Organizational Note

According to [Wikipedia](#), "The International Order of Twelve Knights and Daughters of Tabor is a black fraternal organization best known as the sponsor of the Taborian Hospital. It was founded in 1872 in Independence, Missouri, by Moses Dickson, an ex-slave born in Cincinnati, Ohio, on April 5, 1824. The order's statement of principles pledged to advance "Christianity, education, morality and temperance and the art of governing, self-reliance and true manhood and womanhood". Like many other fraternal societies at the time, it offered sickness and burial insurance and a means for members to socialize.

Scope and Content

Constitution, By-laws and Rules of Order of the Maids and Pages of Honor. The organization was known as the Children of Mt. Tabor, or Maids and Pages of Honor of the Temple and Tabernacle of Knights of Tabor.
