The Norman Shannon and Emmy Lou P. Illges Gallery

The Norman Shannon and Emmy Lou P. Illges Gallery is located in the Corn Center for the Visual Arts. It occupies 3,250 square feet with 20-foot ceilings. The gallery has been designed to accommodate professional art exhibitions as well as student exhibitions such as the annual Senior Thesis exhibition. The gallery program presents 6 - 8 exhibitions per year, both national and international in scope, often with accompanying lectures and gallery talks. The Illges Gallery is free and open to the public.

The CSU Department of Art is pleased to announce *What Color Is Water? Growing up Black in a Segregated South*, an exhibition by Annie Greene in the Schley Gallery at the Corn Center for the Visual Arts. Annie Lucille Greene is a Georgia native, painter, craftswoman, and retired educator. She is best known for her yarn paintings. Her recognizable style is distinguished by her use of colorful yarns outlined in black embroidery thread. Her paintings frequently reflect culturally and socially relevant images of her life as an African American in the rural South.



Her first book, *Georgia Farm Life in the 1940's*, was published in 2005 and features a collection of yarn paintings based on her memories of summers spent on her grandparents' farm in Adel.

In this exhibition, Greene narrates her early life leading up to desegregation. She spent her childhood in Hinesville, finished high school in Hogansville, and attended Spelman College in Atlanta. After completing her undergraduate degree at Albany State College, she began teaching in Thomasville in 1954 and took a job in LaGrange in 1955, where she taught until her retirement in 1989. She earned a master's degree in art education from New York University in 1961 because Georgia gave her an out-of-state tuition voucher. Many southern states used tuition vouchers as a way of avoiding the expense of providing "separate but equal" post-graduate educational opportunities for African Americans.

She and her husband Oliver raised their family and continue to live in LaGrange, Georgia.

The Art Lab gallery is located in the newly renovated Seaboard Depot Art Studios. Art Lab is a 450 square foot exhibition space for new and emerging media, Digital Arts and Design, and experimental exhibitions. Art Lab also supports the VASRP program and adjacent studios by allowing short-term, working installations. Like the Illges Gallery, this space features track lighting and projection capabilities. Exhibition receptions and special events are open to the public.
