The Center for International Education would like to express our deep gratitude to Dr. Neal McCrillis for his years of work and dedicated service as Executive Director for the Center for International Education at Columbus State University. In spring 2017 McCrillis accepted the position of Vice Provost for International Affairs at the University of Illinois at Chicago. Nearly twenty years ago in 1998, he came to CSU as the Mildred Miller Fort Foundation Eminent Scholar Chair of International Education and Executive Director of the Center for International Education. As the title implies, McCrillis had a major role in building CSU's strong study abroad programs and on campus international education opportunities. He served in multiple roles within the University System of Georgia, including Chair of the System Council on International Education, and has received high honors for his work and advancement of international education. Under McCrillis's leadership, CSU received the 2014 Paul Simon Award for Comprehensive Internationalization. The impact of his work will continue to be felt by our scholastic community for many years to come.

Dr. Neal McCrillis's absence, Dr. Becky Becker has assumed the role of Interim Executive Director of the Center for International Education after having served as Assistant Director for two years. Becker joined the CIE as International Studies Certificate Coordinator in 2013 while continuing to teach and direct in the Department of Theatre. Prior to that time she was very active in the International Learning Community, international faculty development opportunities, leading and teaching study abroad courses.

Stepping into the role of Interim Assistant Director is Dr. Shamim Khan. Khan is currently a professor of computer science at CSU. He has taught many different courses in computer science in the United States, Asia, and Australia. He has led CSU Study Abroad courses as well, and was the founding Chair of the CSU Undergraduate Research and Creative Endeavors (SRACE) Committee. Khan has received multiple awards for his contributions to computer science, and he has volunteered numerous hours in the community for science and technology events around Columbus. He is a welcome addition to the CIE.

Finally, the CIE is pleased to welcome Dr. Dan Ross, who accepted a new position as Oxford Program Director during spring 2017. Ross began his career as a professor of English at CSU in 1990. His fields of interest are Irish Literature, Victorian Literature, and Modern British Literature. While at CSU, Ross has served as site director for CSU Study Abroad Programs in Japan and England. He has received multiple awards for his work and contributions to the literary world. The CIE is excited to welcome two new staff members, Dr. Ross and Dr. Khan.

New Short-Term Study Abroad Opportunities During 2016-2017

Columbus State University and the Center for International Education work diligently to provide students with multiple opportunities to study abroad. Studying abroad allows students to become globally minded as they strive to earn credits towards their degrees.

This year the Center for International Education offered two new spring break programs and one new Maymester program respectively: The Intercultural Leadership Service Learning Program in Costa Rica, The Ireland Leadership in Education Program, and The CSU in Southern Spain Spanish Immersion Program. All three new programs have been successful.

Of the three new programs, the Intercultural Leadership Service Learning Program was a unique program that combined three units on campus: the Center for International Education (CIE), The Office of Diversity and the Servant Leadership Program. The goal of the program was to continue to increase student diversity in study abroad programs and to expand the types of programs offered. Led by Ms. Kory Saunders, Program Director

and Study Abroad Coordinator at the CIE, Dr. Wendi Jenkins, Site Director and Director of the Servant Leadership Program, and Ms. Johniqua Williams, Student Development Specialist for Diversity, this program was in partnership with Global Visions International (GVI). All three served as faculty for the program.

Twelve Students explored diversity and

servant leadership through a lens cross-cultural while abroad. Students engaged with the GVI staff, volunteers, and local community as they completed various service projects throughout the week spent in Costa Rica. Students also interacted with native school teachers, community leaders, and volunteers while experiencing the cultural diversity of Quepos, el Cocal and Manuel Antonio. The students sanded, primed, and painted the community center, expanded a playground, and built shaded areas around the center, and created a mural that they conceptualized, drew and painted. What made the mural so special is the palms of the tree were the palms of the study abroad students' hands, the GVI staff, local children and others in

the community. All of the participants enjoyed shared fellowship and conversation with the locals during traditional Costa Rican meals, and explored Quepos, Costa Rica's rich history during their free time. The most rewarding aspect for the faculty was having the students ask if this program would be offered again as some were considering participating a second time.

International Students and International Student Athletes are High Achievers

Columbus State University welcomes students from all over the world. Each semester CSU hosts approximately 140 students from over 40 different countries. Exchange students may study for one or two semesters while the majority of the students complete degrees at CSU. At the end of Spring Semester 2017 twenty-eight international students graduated from CSU during three separate ceremonies. A large majority of these students were student athletes and Computer Science Master's program students.

Columbus State University's men's and women's tennis team included 13 international students this past semester. The CSU NCAA Division II fourth ranked Women's team made it all the way to the National Quarterfinals this year. They closed out the season 25 -3 overall which is the third highest win total for them in 16 seasons under Coach Even Isaacs. The women's team also matched the longest run in program history by reaching the quarterfinals for the fifth time.

The CSU NCAA Division II third ranked Men's team made it to the National Semi-Finals this year. They closed out the year at 25 – 4 overall which is the most wins in the 16 year tenure of Coach Evan Isaacs. CSU matched its longest ever postseason run.

Another important CSU team is the Women's Soccer team. It includes 3 international students. The CSU NCAA Division II 4th ranked Lady Cougars made it to the semifinals this year. One of our international students, Hugrun Elvarsdottir from Gardabaer, Iceland was named a D2CCA All American for her achievements on and off the field. Congratulations to these outstanding students and their teams.




Kiongozi Award Winner: Saravinder Pannu of New Zealand

The word "kiongozi" means "leader" in Swahili. Each year the Center for International Education selects an international student who has shown outstanding leadership, has excelled in the classroom, and has assisted in the internationalization of the campus. The Kiongozi Award recipient is a person who cares deeply about the international student population as well as advancing issues of internationalization both on campus and in the Columbus community.

This year's Kiongozi Award was presented to Saravinder Pannu. As an International Student Services Scholarship award student, Pannu was always available to assist the Center for International Education for events. She was a member of our high achieving CSU Women's Tennis Team. Pannu was a Communications major from New Zealand. She graduated during Spring 2017 but her contribution to the CSU campus will long be remembered.

International Studies Certificate Gateway Course Eligible for Core Credit

Columbus State University's International Studies Certificate completed its fourth year of implementation during 2016-2017. Under the coordination of theatre professor, Dr. Becky Becker, now Interim Executive Director for the Center for International Education, the certificate has grown relatively quickly to include approximately 55 students since its inception in 2013. Becker has taught INTS 2105 Introduction to International and Cross-Cultural Studies, the gateway course for the certificate program, every fall since 2013, later offering one section of the course each spring semester.

During fall semester 2016, the CIE submitted a proposal to the University Curriculum Committee (UCC) requesting that INTS 2105 be included as an option within CSU's general education core curriculum in Areas B and E. Following approval by the UCC, the proposal was sent on to the USG Council on General Education for review. In mid-March, Becker received word that the request had been approved, meaning that INTS 2105 will officially be offered in Areas B and E during fall 2017. Until now, INTS 2105 was the one course within the ISC curriculum that could only be counted as an elective. According to Becker, "This change will allow students in majors with very few electives to earn the International Studies Certificate more easily. For anyone hoping to bring global learning to their degree path, this is great news."
