Spring 2020	MUSA 4311	Camille Saint-Saëns' Sonata for Clarinet and Piano, Op. 167: Its Place in History	I will be working on Saint-Saëns' piece throughout the semester, and this could lead to either a performance of the piece for our clarinet studio class or possibly in the studio recital. In addition to this preparation, I will prepare an 8 to 10 page paper in Chicago Turabian style that will include a biography of the composer, what was occurring in his life when he wrote the piece, a description of his compositional style and its place in music history, and compare and contrast his work to the work of other famous composers from the same time period. I hope that by gaining a deeper understanding of not only the piece but also the composer that I will be able to more effectively perform the piece.
Spring 2020	MUSE 4206	Enhancing Student Learning of Music Theory through Targeting Various Learning Types	Music theory is the study of the complex language of music. It allows one to further understand the complexities of the guidelines used to compose music for hundreds of years, to interpret and support musical decisions in an educated way to further express the mood and tone of a work, and enhances the musical experience by adding academic reasoning to a more creative and abstract concept. Music theory is a culmination of history, science, math, and English/language arts while still encouraging innovative thinking and playful learning. Since it is the basis of all Western music, it is vital that music students of all ages have a firm grasp of its concepts.
