Spring 2020	NURS 4280	Appendicitis and Pediatrics: A P.I.C.O.T. Question	Appendicitis is a rapidly developing acute inflammatory process that affects the appendix. Approximately 250,000 are diagnosed yearly and, of this, nearly 80,000 children. This condition is the most common reason for pediatric emergency surgery. The P.I.C.O.T. method was implemented for this contract. This abbreviation describes a formula used to create clinical questions and to guide nursing research. The P.I.C.O.T. method helped to create the clinical question of this contract, "Does educating parents on appendicitis prevention and signs/symptoms help lower the rate of disease progression in pediatric patients?" In this contract, the signs/symptoms, complications, prevention methods, and treatment methods of pediatric appendicitis are presented. The purpose of this contract is to educate parents, and the overall public, on pediatric appendicitis. This education should then decrease the complications of appendicitis and the severity of treatment.
Spring 2020	NURS 3555	Appendicitis and Pediatrics: A P.I.C.O.T. Question	Appendicitis is a rapidly developing acute inflammatory process that affects the appendix. There are approximately 250,000 diagnoses annually and, of this, nearly 80,000 children annually. Appendicitis is one of the most common causes of abdominal pain in children and the most common cause of pediatric emergency surgery. In order to conduct this contract, the P.I.C.O.T. method was implemented. This mnemonic is used to create clinical questions and to guide nursing research. The clinical question of this contract is, "Does educating parents on appendicitis prevention and signs/symptoms help lower the rate of disease progression in pediatric patients?" This contract details the signs/symptoms, complications, prevention methods and treatment methods in order to educate the audience on pediatric appendicitis. Information on pediatric appendicitis from other countries were also examined to compare appendicitis incidences to the U.S.
