

This spring, Honors Students had fun and explored their kitchens by making exciting food in our "Bake Off Challenge" Seminar!








The course concluded with a trip to Columbus' EPIC Restaurant, one of our best local fine dining eateries. Students were able to cook with experienced chefs and make their own meal!
