

Collaboration Between the USG and the TCSG Policy

Summary

Columbus State partners with technical colleges in Georgia to ensure for students the ease and flexibility of transfer of courses from the college to Columbus State University.

Purpose

The policy presents the stipulations for an articulation agreement and the approving authorities that allow for a collaborative partnership between CSU and colleges within the TCSG.

Policy

The approving authorities for articulation agreements are the presidents of each institution and the chief academic officers. The articulation agreement lists the start date, and either institution may terminate this Agreement upon giving written notice to the other institution. Such notice should be given one full semester prior to the agreement being cancelled.

Articulation agreements ensure ease and flexibility of transfer of courses. Agreements will list the course equivalencies between institutions.

Articulation agreements must list the CSU program that aligns with the technical college associate degrees, and the GPA thresholds, for example, "Students must have earned a minimum grade of C in each course in Area A and Area F and also a GPA of at least 2.5 for the combined coursework in Areas A and F."

The partner technical college graduates will receive transfer credits for courses completed at their particular institution toward Columbus State University's general core requirements and program of study. The agreements must list the maximum number of transfer credits. Students must satisfy residency and program required upper division hours to graduate from Columbus State University.
