

Spring 2020 Fraternity and Sorority Life Executive Report

Academics

- The Spring 2020 semester Greek GPA of 3.22 reflected a 12.58% increase from fall 2019 (2.86) and a 17.09% increase from spring 2019 (2.75)
- 21.9% of members of fraternities and sororities performed above 3.5 GPA. This reflects a 3.09% decrease from Fall 2019 (22.6%) and 1.3% increase from Spring 2019 (21.6%).
- The fraternity and sorority community GPA (3.23) was **above** the All-CSU undergraduate semester GPA of 3.22.

Leadership Development

- The Fraternity and Sorority Life Department and Greek Governing Councils successfully sponsored for the third year the FSL 101 sessions.
- Fraternity and Sorority Life Department hosted the annual FSL Leadership Retreat with off campus with 18 chapter leaders.
- All Fraternity and Sorority new members were certified by the Step Up Bystander Intervention Program.
- For the first time we took three students to the inaugural South Eastern Greek Leadership Association Conference held in Atlanta, GA.

Recruitment, retention & Expansion

- Total fraternity and sorority community membership reached 242 during the Spring 2020 semester, a decrease of 62 members from Fall 2019. We acknowledge that recruitment numbers have been impacted due to the impact of COVID-19. Currently 5.84% of Columbus State University students are members of a fraternity or sorority. This represents a **decrease** of 19.87% from Fall 2018.
- During the Spring 2020 semester, the Fraternity and Sorority Life Department and Greek Governing Councils sponsored the Fraternity and Sorority Life 101; Meet the Greeks, New Member Summit, the Professional Development Series, and Position Round Tables.

Service & Philanthropy

- During the Fall 2019 and Spring, 2020 semester, fraternity and sorority members completed over 4,850 hours of hands-on community service hours.
- During COVID-19 our National Pan-Hellenic Council raised over \$1,400 for CSU's Food Pantry.

Council Management

- The College Panhellenic Council restructured their executive board to better distribute responsibilities, along with voting members into the position for the first time.
- During the 2019 – 2020 academic year nine out of our fifteen organizations received Diamond status on our Pillars of Excellence Accreditation program.
