- Old Business

- CPD Advisory Council Update
 - President Markwood approved SGA proposal for the Columbus Police Advisory Council
 - Since the Police Advisory Council was approved, it now needs members to participate

- Financial Update & Procedure
 - Instructions on how to submit a funding request is through the CSU Student Government Association website
 - Organizations can request a maximum amount of \$1500
 - If an organization requests more than \$500, it must be presented/approved by forum

 - Expectations, Questions, Comments, and Concerns will be addressed

- Monthly Oversight
 - Oversights are due at the end of September (Reports of August as well)

- Violation if organization is not on a committee

● New Business

- RSO rights and abilities
 - RSOs can ask questions by raising their placards or hands
 - Great reference is Robert's Rule of Order (motions, debates, caucuses, etc.)
 - Orgs have the ability to to make motions after being acknowledged
 - RSOs have the ability to present resolutions
 - Resolution: a document expressing an opinion or a desire for change. Anyone may write a resolution to be considered by Student Government, but a current Student Senator or Graduate Student Senate Voting Member must sponsor it
 - Please submit draft resolutions to Chief Justice Yarborough via email or mailbox
- Appeals Process
 - Appeal: is a parliamentary procedure that is addressed in Robert's Rule of Order. This procedure allows two members who disagree with the Chair's ruling to force a vote on it.
 - If the Chair declares that an amendment is not related to the main motion (not germane or relevant) and therefore not permitted, a member can say 'I appeal the decision of the Chair
 - -When a member appeals the decision of the Chair, and the motion is seconded, the Chair submits the ruling to the group for a vote. Members may then vote in favour of the ruling of the Chair or they can vote against the ruling - which would reverse

the decision. The Chair should respond by saying; 'An appeal has been made that the amendment just offered is germane

- When a presiding officer makes a ruling and a member disagrees, the proper thing to do is to rise and say, "Mr. President, I appeal from the ruling of the chair." If another member seconds the appeal, the procedure is rather simple: The president puts the question to the members, who decide whether to sustain his ruling. But under Robert's Rules, the presiding officer gets to speak first and last in any discussion about the appeal or their decision.
 - If anyone has a reason to appeal something, you have the opportunity to do so at Forum or in a written letter. Any appeals that anyone has will be taken up with me, the Chief Justice, and/or the Executive team in the appropriate setting.
