The Panhellenic Council at CSU develops and maintains women's sorority life and interfraternity relations to a high level of accomplishment, and in doing so:

- Promotes superior scholarship as basic to intellectual achievement;

Each member sorority sends two delegates to the meetings, and these women serve as the representative voice of their chapters on all action items.
