Columbus State University and Albany Technical College Transfer Articulation Agreement May 15, 2017

Introduction

This agreement formally recognizes that Columbus State University (CSU) and Albany Technical College (ATC) are active educational partners in providing educational opportunities for currently enrolled and potential students of both institutions. Agreement to this partnership requires a commitment by both institutions to serve and facilitate a student's ability to transfer into a degree program without jeopardizing the intended mission and stated goals of either institution.

Agreement on Accreditation

Both parties agree to maintain regional accreditation through the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC). Should either institution lose accreditation through SACSCOC, the other institution may terminate the agreement through formal written notice.

Agreement on Communication

Columbus State University and Albany Technical College agree to cooperate in communicating with each other concerning the articulation relationship between the two institutions. Communications may include common publications and announcements concerning their affiliation. Announcements of this articulation and of changes in the relationship will have a coordinated release to the public from both institutions. The institutions will encourage the dissemination of information about programs in this agreement to interested and qualified students, with both institutions providing advising and counseling to prospective students.

Agreement on Articulated Courses

This agreement is specifically for students completing the courses included in this document at Albany Technical College who are transferring to complete a baccalaureate degree at Columbus State University. This agreement does not apply to other institutions in the University System of Georgia. Any Albany Technical College student who completes the courses detailed herein at ATC, is in good standing at ATC, and meets the appropriate admission requirements to attend Columbus State University will be ensured that the courses listed in this agreement earned at Albany Technical College will transfer to Columbus State University. A minimum grade of "C" or above will be required for ENGL 1101, ENGL 1102, and any other courses designated by specific majors in accordance with their program requirements.

No student may transfer more than 75% of the credit required for an associate or baccalaureate degree. Both institutions are committed to advising students accordingly so that credit earned is applied appropriately to the degree. Students who plan to change from a non-science major to a science major may need to take additional courses in Areas A-E. This agreement replaces any former agreement.

Agreement on Maintenance and Review

At least one administrative or faculty member will be appointed from each participating college/university to act as a primary point of contact and agent for this agreement, to speak for the institution, and to communicate details and modifications to respective faculty, advisors, and others with interest at the individual institutions.

This agreement will be in effect for three years from the date of administrative endorsement. Review of course content changes will be completed annually. It will be automatically renewed unless one of the parties expresses, in writing, its desire to terminate the agreement, giving six months' notification with the effective date to be the last day of the following academic term.

⁷ECON 1101 does not satisfy the requirements for ECON 2105 or ECON 2106 for Business majors at CSU. If a business major takes PSYC 1101 and SOCI 1101 and earns a productive grade in each, he/she may use one course to satisfy Area E and the other to satisfy the Area I Non-Business Elective.

⁸A student may receive credit for either BUSN 1300 OR MGMT 1120 for BUSA 2115.

⁹While these courses meet the requirements for equivalent upper division courses in the program, the student must earn the requisite number of upper division credits (39 semester hours) required for the four year degree.

¹⁰The following courses are equivalent to CRJU 3555: Selected Topics in Criminal Justice – CRJU 1021, CRJU 1052, CRJU 2110, and CRJU 2201. Students will receive credit for CRJU 3555 a maximum of two times.

¹¹ Students must complete the required field experience to receive credit at CSU if they did not complete it as part of the class at ATC.

¹²ATC's MATH 1113 (3-0-3) satisfies requirements in the same way as CSU's MATH 1113 (4-0-4), but students may need to make up an extra credit hour with an adviser-approved elective elsewhere in their program.
