

*During FY22 a service call was redefined as a situation in which an individual calls and request a specific service; ie access to a building, jump-starting a vehicle, etc.

The Campus Climate Survey was emailed to students, faculty, and staff on April 20, 2022. 566 people responded to the survey. The vast majority of respondants identified as undergraduate, white females, non-residents, spending time on the main campus. Key findngs included:

83% Indicated they knew how to contact University Police.
40% Used Police services within the last two years.
92% Indicated the services were handled in a respectful and professional manner.

The majority felt very safe during the day, and moderately safe at night
