The Patient Health Questionnaire is a nine-item depression scale that was administered to all students who visited the clinic. The questionnaire functions as a screening tool and can aid in diagnosing students and tracking their symptoms.



There were 149 students who scored over 10, which indicated moderate to severe depression. All students were given the chance to participate in further assistance, and 137 of them took advantage of the opportunity.

\*During FY22 a service call was redefined as a situation in which an individual calls and request a specific service; ie access to a building, jump-starting a vehicle, etc.

The Campus Climate Survey was emailed to students, faculty, and staff on April 20, 2022. 566 people responded to the survey. The vast majority of respondents identified as undergraduate, white females, non-residents, spending time on the main campus.

Key findings included:

83% Indicated they knew how to contact University Police.

40% Used Police services within the last two years.

92% Indicated the services were handled in a respectful and professional manner.

The majority felt very safe during the day, and moderately safe at night.





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
