Fraternity & Sorority Life

Spring 2019 Fraternity and Sorority Life Executive Report

Academics

- The spring 2019 semester Greek GPA of 2.75 reflected a 7.7% decrease from spring 2018 (2.95) and 2.8% decrease from fall 2018 (2.83).
- 21.6% of members of fraternities and sororities performed above 3.5 GPA. This reflects a 43% decrease from spring 2018 (38.7%) and 9.3% increase from fall 2018 (19.6%).
- The fraternity and sorority community GPA (2.83) was below the All-CSU undergraduate semester GPA of 2.87.

Leadership Development

- The Fraternity and Sorority Life Department and Greek Governing Councils successfully sponsored for the second year the FSL 101 sessions with over 200 student attendees.
- Fraternity and Sorority Life Department hosted the annual FSL Leadership Retreat with off campus with 20 chapter leaders.
- All Fraternity and Sorority Chapters were certified by the Step Up Bystander Intervention Program.

Recruitment, retention & Expansion

- Total fraternity and sorority community membership reached 315 during the spring 2019 semester, a decrease of 10 members from fall 2018. Currently 7.1% of Columbus State University students are members of a fraternity or sorority. This represents an increase of 7.5% from fall 2017.
- Four IFC fraternities welcomed over 50 new members this fall; Four CPH sororities welcomed over 50 new members and five NPHC organizations welcomed 30 new members.
- During the spring 2019 semester, the Fraternity and Sorority Life Department and Greek Governing Councils sponsored the Fraternity and Sorority Life 101; Meet the Greeks, Variety Show, Greek Day of Service, Leadership Conference, and Campus Appreciation Cookout with over 1.500 Greek and non-Greek student attendance.

Service & Philanthropy

- During the fall 2018 and spring, 2019 semester, fraternity and sorority members completed 1,286 hours of hands-on community service hours.
- During the fall 2018 and spring 2019 semester, Greeks raised over \$15,000.00 for charities.

Council Management

- Fraternity and Sorority Life Department Sponsored two students to attend the Undergraduate Interfraternity Institute in the summer.
- Zoya Johnson represented CSU as the UIFI Student Coordinator; 20 student coordinators are selected each summer.
