UTeach Scholarships

Students majoring in math, science, or computer science education may apply for scholarships of up to \$1,500. To apply for a scholarship, students must meet the following requirements:

- Successful completion of Step 1 course (UTCH 1201)
- Can demonstrate progress in a UTeach program of study, toward a degree and teacher certification in STEM
- Full time student at CSU (preferred)
- Minimum 2.5 GPA
- Active participant in WeTeach activities

Scholarships are awarded annually, as funding allows.

Dr. Michael Edmondson Science Education Endowed Scholarship

Students must be enrolled in a science education degree plan (biology, chemistry or earth & spaces sciences) at CSU, live in the Chattahoochee Valley region, and maintain at least a 2.5 GPA.

To be eligible for these \$15,000 scholarships, you must be a junior or senior in a UTeach program of study.

TEACH Grant

The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant provides up to \$4,000 per year to full-time undergraduate or graduate students enrolled in eligible CSU programs of study. Students must agree to serve four academic years as a full-time teacher in a high-need field at an eligible school. To qualify for a TEACH Grant, students must meet and maintain academic requirements of a 3.25 GPA or score above the 75th percentile on a national college admissions test. Failure to complete the service obligation will result in the TEACH Grant funds converting to a Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan with interest charged from the date the grant was disbursed.

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Knowles Science Teaching Foundation

Georgia Intern Fellowships for Teachers

Founded in 1991 as a program of the Georgia Institute of Technology's CEISMC, GIFT provides paid summer STEM internships in industry workplaces and university laboratories for K-12 science, mathematics, and technology teachers. Teachers spend 4 to 7 weeks experiencing first-hand how industrial scientists and researchers approach problems, design experiments, interpret data, communicate findings, and develop and implement workplace solutions.
